Join us to celebrate The Jesus Movement.

As we have been listening and discussing Presiding Bishop Michael Curry's sermons about the Jesus Movement, we have been reminded again and again that the Jesus' way of love begins at the cross and blooms at Easter.

Presiding Bishop Curry, preaching at Charlottesville, VA month after the deadly and racist demonstration, said, "Jesus says from the cross, hanging, dying from the hands of those who had tortured him, "Father forgive them, they know not what they do." This the way of love." ¹

Easter is about celebrating the way of love but we cannot celebrate unless we remembering Good Friday and the cross. Together the Passion and the Resurrection have the power to change the world.

We invite all to join us for Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday as well as Easter. We pray that remembering the love of God show us through this most holy week will renew and strengthen us all. Presiding Bishop Curry reminds us that, "This kind of love is counter intuitive – It is counter intuitive to this world.....but it can change the world.

TIFFANY WINDOWS AT ST. STEPHEN'S EPISCOPAL CHURCH, LYNN ON SATURDAY, APRIL 27TH FROM 11AM TO 3PM. Come and learn about the 41 exquisite Tiffany stained glass windows in this beautiful church built in 1880. They are perhaps the oldest ecclesiastical Tiffany windows in the world. Two of the three that are wall sized were designed by the famous sculptor Augustus Saint-Gaudens, and are the only windows that he designed. The building, designed by Ware & Van Brundt, was given by Enoch Redington Mudge in memory of his children Fannie Olive (Mudge) Van Brundt and her brother Lt. Col. Charles Redington Mudge who died at Gettysburg on July 3, 1863. The family are buried there.

In celebration of the 175th anniversary of the parish there will be an organ concert at 2:15 pm after the end of the tours. The final tour will start at 1:30 pm. 


