From the Interim,

Thank you for the warm welcome to St. Stephen's. November was an eventful month. The joyous celebrations of Rev. Jane Gould's seventeen years as your Priest and Rector were a fitting tribute for what she had meant to St. Stephen's. As sad as it might have been, a good goodbye is

a critical gift to her so she may begin the next part of her ministry knowing that she has been loved and cherished. It also a critical gift to yourselves so you may enter into this time of transition ready to discover what is ahead. I hope that as your Interim Priest, I will be able to hold and guide you through these times.
