From the Interim Priest

Advent is a season to prepare as we anticipate the arrival of the Christ child, the baby Jesus born in a manger. This year, at St. Stephen's we are also getting close to the calling of a new rector.

This month the Search Committee will be inviting the three finalists to visit and to have face to face interviews. They will then be making a recommendation to the Vestry. Upon approval by the vestry and the details of their contract are worked out, the candidate will be presented to the parish. Their identities will remain confidential until that time. However, just as we are preparing for Christmas, we can begin to prepare to welcome the new Rector.

The Vestry will be appointing a Transition Committee who be taking the lead in the logistics of welcoming the Rector. These duties include helping them find a place to live and getting settled in, planning events so your rector can get to know the people and programs of the parish. They will also help organize the Celebration of New Ministry, as service at which the Bishop officially installs the Rector. Besides these "official" tasks, the members of the Transition Committee can serve as a sounding board for the priest and a supporter of her or his programs. If you know of anyone who might want to help with this, please contact the wardens.

As for me, the next few months will be a time for wrapping up my ministry here, preparing to hand-off my duties and saying goodbye. It has been an incredible honor to serve as your interim priest. St. Stephen's remains the most dynamic church I have ever served. I am excited for your future. I anticipate that I will serve as an interim somewhere else.

Meanwhile, we continue to prepare to celebrate the incarnation of our Lord and Savior. May the power of God's love continually shine in your hearts as we look forward to what God will be doing with and through us in the coming year.
