

#### From the Interim Priest

A Blessed Epiphany to all,

The Season of Epiphany, begins on January 6th and continues until Ash Wednesday, which is very early this year, February 14th. It is the season when we reflect on the light of Christ in our lives and in our world. Here at St Stephen's it marks the beginning of the formal search for your new Rector. The search committee has been formed with Helen Patmon and Steve Switzer agreeing to be Co-chairs. We will be hearing more in the coming weeks as the committees begins to meet and plan out the process. Please keep them in your prayers.

Meanwhile, I would like to invite us to reflect on how God is leading us in this process. The Biblical story that I find useful during a time of transition is the story of the people of Judah being in exile in Babylon. The year 587 B.C.E. marked the destruction of Jerusalem and the Temple. The people of Judah were taken into Babylon. It was a time of great loss, but also marks the beginning of something new. The Jewish leaders refused to be assimilated and disappear into history. Rather, they figured out how to remain the people of God without being gathered around the Temple. They had to remember their stories, thus most of the Hebrew Scripture was written down and collated into the Torah at that time. The community shifted its focus from offering sacrifices at the Temple to the study and living out the Law as given to Moses. The center of the community shifted from the Temple to the Synagogue. Being Jewish at this time became a matter of the study of the Law, personal practice, and community worship.

The change during the Exile did not happen quickly. There was not a clear set of choices. Rather, it came out of a lot of prayer, reflection, and trying new things. Not everything they tried worked but they remained focused on what it meant to be God's chosen people. By the time they were able to return to Jerusalem, they were a very different people. The Temple was eventually rebuilt, but a huge change had taken place so that Jews were able to thrive, not just in Judah but, throughout the world.

Thanks be to God that our trials at St. Stephen's are not as dire as the Exile, but we can learn from their experience. We are in a time to explore and try new things and ideas. We do not need to recreate as fast as possible what St. Stephen's had with Rev. Jane. We can hold on to the best that she gave us but also try out some new ways of being Church. This is a time to explore and be creative. I know that God's light is shining on us as we discover what is possible.

### STEWARDS OF RESOURCES

**VESTRY SUMMARY: DECEMBER 17.** The Vestry discussed the new rector search process with Ed Rewolinski, the diocesan search consultant. The process is moving forward with teams being formed. Vestry reviewed year-to-date financials and discussed the 2018 budget and stewardship. Grants were discussed and the challenge of tracking all grant activities. The vestry nominating committee was formed - three vestry members will be leaving this year. The Building Committee reported with an update on the repair to the existing lawn sign, and installation of an electronic sign in the spring - the Graham Suite kitchen was also discussed with the hope of finding funding to move forward.

STEWARDSHIP MINISTRY TEAM PLANS PLEDGE FOLLOW UP. As we reach toward our pledge goal of \$120,000, the Stewardship Ministry Team and Vestry thank all who have pledged for 2017. Pledge envelopes and thank you Episcopal Church calendars are available in the Galahad Area; please call the office if you would like your envelopes mailed to you. Even as we move toward our pledge goal, the Vestry conversation about income made clear we actually need to surpass our goal if we hope to fund the ministry envisioned when leaders discussed the expense side of the 2017 budget. Please help by letting your light shine by supporting God's work in and through St. Stephen's.

ARE YOU CALLED TO SERVE? Our Parish, Deanery, and Diocese need leaders and the good news is that the leaders we need are sitting in our pews. Please think, pray, and talk to Nominating Committee members Kevin Neil, Pam Poppe, Robin Washington, and Kendra Zimiroski as you reflect on whether God might be calling you to serve. Although nominations can be made at the Annual Meeting on Sunday, February 11, the Nominating Committee hopes to publish in the Annual Report a full slate of candidates for Junior & Senior Warden, Treasurer, Clerk, and Vestry (three 3-year terms and one 1-year term) as well as Deanery (5 delegates) and Diocesan Convention (2 delegates & 2 alternates). The deadline for nominations is Sunday, January 28.

ANNUAL MEETING AND POTLUCK LUNCH FEBRUARY 11, 2017 AT NOON. Mark your calendars now for the Annual Meeting and Potluck on Sunday, February 11 at noon. Episcopal governance requires the participation of our members in our Annual Meeting. The Episcopal Church defines members as communicants who contribute financially to the parish. We hope to have Annual Reports available by Sunday, February 4. Of course, timely completion of the Annual Report depends on all ministry team leaders submitting Annual Reports by Friday, January 5.
