AN INVITATION TO A HOLY LENT

In the Ash Wednesday service there is an invitation to the observance of a Holy Lent:

By self –examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's Holy Word.

My experience is that it is always easier to live out such observances together rather than alone. A number of years ago I tried to take on the practice of fasting from sunrise to sunset as Muslims do during their penitential season of Ramadan. I was not very successful. Reflecting upon this experience, I realize that the big difference was that I was trying to fast alone and in isolation. The Muslim practice is most often done as a community. They eat before sunrise with their families and often gather in the evening to pray and break fasting together. It still requires personal discipline, but it is a fuller experience done as part of a community.

Here at St. Stephen's we are offering a number of ways to gather together for the observance of a Holy Lent. I invite and encourage you to take advantage of them.

Mondays: Spanish classes beginning March 23rd at 6:30 PM

Tuesdays: Praying with the Monks of SSJE in Cambridge at 5:30 PM (We will carpool,

leaving St. Stephen's at 4:00 PM)

Wednesdays: Lenten Series: *Meeting God through Art* - 6:00 -7:30 PM

Thursdays: Healing Service and Holy Communion - Noon

Fridays: Stations of the Cross - 12:30 PM

Helping with the Food Pantry 2:30 -4:00 PM

Sundays: Holy Eucharist - 8:00 and 10:00 AM

Centering Prayer - 9:00 AM

I pray that that we may grow in faith this Lent and be fully prepared to rejoice as we celebrate the Resurrection on Easter.

UPDATE ON THE SEARCH PROCESS

In late January the Search Committee reported to the vestry that they were not able to reach a consensus on a candidate for Rector and handed the search process back to the Vestry. The Vestry met with the Rev. Canon Martha Hubbard, on February 13th to explore our options moving forward. After discussing forming a new Search Committee or requesting the Bishop to appoint a Priest-in-Charge, the Vestry decided to ask Bishop Gate's to find us a Priest-in-Charge. The candidate will have to be approved by the Vestry. The Priest-in-Charge will come with a three year contract with the option of becoming the Rector in the third year.

We are currently waiting for the Bishop to recommend a candidate.

Excerpts from the Senior Warden to the Vestry, January 29, 2020

The Search Committee met tonight to discuss and decide upon their final candidate to recommend to the Vestry for consideration of the position of Rector. This evening, Steve Switzer, co-chair of the Search Committee, called me with all the committee members present, to notify me that regrettably the Search Committee was unable to arrive at a consensus to make a final recommendation. I thanked the whole committee for their hard and diligent work through this whole process affirming that they had a difficult job.....

The members of Search Committee deserve our heartfelt gratitude for all of their countless hours over nearly two years spent on discerning the life of our parish, our parish's needs, our parish's aspirations and the qualifications and gifts that each of the candidates possess whom have applied for this position. Their decision was not reached lightly.

Please continue to hold the parish, the candidates and everyone who has worked tirelessly on this process in your prayers. We know that with God's help, the right candidate we become known to St. Stephen's!

The following thoughts were compiled with suggestions by Emily Sherwood and some thoughts from the two of us.

- Everyone on the Search Committee worked hard and diligently over the past two years.
- Everyone on the Search Committee prayed and searched their heart and conscious about who they thought would be best for the St. Stephen's community.
- Each of the candidates brought different skills and talents and visions of the future for St. Stephen's.
- We sought and received consultation from the Diocese to help us resolve the impasse, held another round of final interviews, but were still unable to come to a consensus on making a recommendation to the Vestry and so the search process has ended without a call.
- Martha reminds us that "Much was discerned in the process that will lead the parish forward--so the search did not fail--it just did not reach the hoped for result of a consensus recommendation."
- We have reported this to the Vestry. For more information on next steps you should consult with the Vestry.
- The candidates shared very personal information with us so we still need to adhere to a strict sense of confidentiality regarding the candidates.

HERE'S THE SCOOP ON "CENTERING PRAYER" AT ST. STEPHEN'S: About 9:15 several parishioners sit quietly at the left front of the church. Their hands are folded in their laps, their eyes are closed. What's going on? Centering prayer. Everybody who'd like to try a new prayer experience is welcome.

Here's what happens. First a bronze pot is struck. The people grow still. Main idea is to clear your head. When you think something (everyone does) you repeat a key word until the mind quiets down again. This helps us find peace and prepare for worship. It is easy to do and works well. You are welcome to join us!

St. Stephen's has received a Congregational Development grant to teach Spanish to our parishioners and staff. A lot of our outreach and social justice work involves working with those for whom Spanish is there first language. The neighborhood around the church is increasingly Spanish speaking. During Lent as we take time to understand our Lord a little deeper, so that Good Friday and Easter become an opportunity to receive all God has to offer. One way to do this is by expoloring new prayer practives. Terri Kay will be presenting Visio Divina on Wednesday evenings through Lent. Viso Divina, Latin for divine seeing, is a comtemplative prayer practice which uses images to help one encounter God's presence in what we see. WOMEN'S GROUP, MARCH 8th 12:00. All women are invited to share in an afternoon of food, fellowship and fun. This month's meeting will be led by St. Andrew's of Marblehead. Please bring a dish to share. This gathering will center around the current exhibit in our Cloister Art Gallery. Art Exhibit @ the Cloister Gallery at St. Andrew's Church

The Cloister Gallery will feature a new show entitled "Black Lives Matter: A Struggle for Justice and Equality" which is an exhibition of small art quilts related to civil rights history and justice reform. Viewers will see images of civil rights leaders and heroes like Harriet Tubman, Shirley Chisholm, Frederick Douglass, Martin Luther King, and President Obama, interwoven with brightly colored fabrics and embellishments. Pete Seeger and his banjo appear on one quilt, which also includes Norman Rockwell's iconic image of a small girl walking to school accompanied by two federal marshals. Titled "Together We Learn to Read and Write," the quilt echoes Seeger's song imaging children learning together in peace and friendship. It commemorates the Supreme Court ruling that racially segregated education is inherently unequal and violates the Constitution. Ms. Earsy, a retired lawyer, began making art quilts in 2006. Her first one celebrated Peace Day, with purple felt praying hands and tiny Tibetan prayer flags. Since then, she's created over 100 art quilts, many of them focused on civil rights. She finds that the practice of designing and sewing small quilts fosters mindfulness and restores her spirits.

Please consider stepping in to lead the Women's Group. Joyce Wallace and Charlotte Breckenridge have been doing such a great job, but as you know, it is time for others to step up into this role to make sure the Women's group continues to thrive and grow.
