From the Interim Priest,

"In the Episcopal Church, WE TREASURE KIDS!"

This slogan was used in a national church campaign in the 1990's. It was part of an effort to shift the thinking of the church that children and youth are only the future rather than being the present central and vital members of the congregation that they are.

At that time, my parish was invited to participate in a pilot project to explore what our individual congregations could do if we took this slogan seriously. We were asked to explore and experiment what "treasuring our kids" might actually look like. We then shared what we learned with about a dozen other parishes in the Diocese as well as with the National Church. It was a creative and exciting process that helped energize my congregation.

I would like St. Stephen's to consider how we might more intentionally treasure our children and our youth. This is not to say that we are not already doing a lot of positive things. We are. However, I hope we can make <u>the whole</u> congregation aware of and engaged in treasuring our kids.

One of the big insights we got from the Treasure Kids Project was the fact that it involved ministry **for** children and youth, ministry **with** children and youth, and ministry **by** children and youth.

Ministry for children and youth involves those things we adults have to teach - the stories of the bible, the traditions and practices of our faith, as well as the values and attitudes behind them. What we also discovered was that we adults needed to ask if the ways we have been doing this are the most effective ways to share our faith. We found that we needed to challenge our assumptions and look at our practices and see if they were actually growing young Christians.

Ministry with children and youth raised the awareness that there are many things we do in church that can include our younger members. They can join in many, if not all the ministries of the Church. This will require some training but most often what is needed is an open heart and a willingness to slow down and be more a companion to our younger members.

Ministry by children and youth is the part that has most moved me. We believe that in Baptism we are all made full members of the Church, the Body of Christ. This includes having spiritual gifts that will build up the body. Even our youngest members have spiritual gifts. I have learned more about the sacredness of the Eucharist from 3 year olds than anyone else. I have learned about loyalty, friendship, and unconditional love from

pre-teens. I have learned about struggle and faith from countless youth. The key has been my willingness to slow down and pay attention.

As I said above, St. Stephen's is doing a lot right. We need to identify those things and understand what makes them effective. We also need to examine the ways in which we are falling short. As we end our program year and begin to plan for the fall, we are being faced with the reality that we will not have the extra clergy and interns to plan our programs. I am hoping that we can begin preparing for the fall by reflecting on ways we can treasure our children and youth and let our actions and programs come out of that.


