Word from the Interim Priest

Grace and peace to everyone connected to St. Stephen's Church,

As we enter the ninth week of the Coronavirus stay at home and social distancing protocols, I am glad to report that St. Stephen's Church continues on. Our Sunday services on Zoom has a growing attendance. It is nice to see each other and worship together. The services are also posted on website, https://www.ststephenslynn.org/ and on our Facebook page https://www.facebook.com/ststephenslynn/. Even while I greatly miss being able to celebrate the Eucharist with all of you, it has been nice to rediscover the service of Morning Prayer.

RE-OPENING: On May 12th we received a directive from our Bishops stating: **Current restrictions on in-person public worship and gatherings in our churches are now extended until July 1, 2020.** ... *Essential office and maintenance functions and life-sustaining neighborhood ministries may continue, provided these are carried out while maintaining recommended physical distancing and cleaning and hygiene protocols, and respecting the maximum number of people allowable under the orders of Governor Baker.* ...

We are profoundly grateful for the dedication and creativity with which congregations are responding to provide alternative, virtual opportunities for worship and fellowship, as well as continued ministry to the most vulnerable in our communities.

Last Friday the church calendar commemorated Julian of Norwich, who is perhaps most widely remembered for the assurance given the mystic by Jesus: "All shall be well, and all shall be well, and all manner of thing shall be well." May we, too, know the assurance of Christ's nurturing and sustaining love, spoken to us in our troubled time.

Applications may be downloaded from the website. Special thanks to all those who have so generously donated to the scholarship fund as well as the past parishioners who created endowed funds to the parish for scholarships.

FOOD PANTRY: The Food Pantry continues to give out record amounts of food on Friday afternoons, except the first Friday of the month. We have had a wonderful team of volunteers from both within and outside of the Parish. The expanded distribution hours are 2 – 4 PM. It is open to all. If you or somebody you know is in need of food, please let them know when we are open. We are especially grateful to the Greater Boston Food Bank for providing us virtually all of the food we are giving out. We are trying to be careful to not have too many volunteers at one time so we can keep practicing social distancing protocols and keep everyone safe.

PRIEST-IN-CHARGE SEARCH: The Rev. Canon Martha Hubbard, has let us know that the Bishop's office has received several applications for the PIC position at St. Stephen's. She and the Bishop have been screening the candidates. In the next few weeks, they will decide on which candidate to submit for the Vestry to consider. Martha also thanks the people of St. Stephen's for your patience.

KIDS IN COMMUNITY: Although Kids in Community Music and Arts Program afterschool has been closed since March 12, the Advisory Board, along with Rev. Tom and Shannon Morrissey, our Program Director, has stayed in regular communication. We are about to take steps to be in touch with the children, first through a mailing to let them know we miss them and are thinking about them. We'll enclose a stamped envelope so they can reply with news of their own. We also want to find out if they have internet access at home so we can offer some online activities for them. Summer camp is, of course, up in the air. Nevertheless, fundraising efforts continue and Shannon has contacted teen mentors from last summer, many of whom are eager to return if possible. Governor Baker plans to give updates on May 18. If camps get a green light, we will start planning for what modifications we would need to make to offer a safe and appropriate program.

PLEDGES AND DONATION: A huge thank you goes out to all those who have been able to keep up with the pledges and those who have made special donations during this time of shutdown. While we have cut back spending every way we can think of, we still have to pay our staff, building costs and other bills. Checks can be mailed to the church. Donations can also be made through our web site.
