A Message from Reverend Greg

Here Comes Summer!

The church building is yearning to be filled once again, to capture the songs of praise and prayers rising heavenward. Hopefully, everyone is looking forward to Summer.

When I was a child, I used to look forward to the month of May. It meant that school would soon be over and Summer vacation would begin. This year, it feels different. I am excited as I was years ago, but this does feel different. You can sense the excitement in the air, but you are fully aware of the anxiety that some still feel. What is of utmost importance is that we exclude no one. We are still very much in this together.

On Sunday, April 25th, the Vestry approved the recommendation by the Reopening Team to open the church to limited capacity of 75 on **Pentecost Sunday, May 23, 2021.** At the end of this newsletter, you will see a *Risk Acknowledgement and Waiver* form which we ask that you fill out and sign if you are planning on attending church in person. Each household must pre-register in order to attend in person services at this time. The form has additional instructions that you should be familiar with prior to returning to the building. We will still provide virtual/on-line services each Sunday. Please fill in the form, sign and bring it with you on May 23rd.

RISK ACKNOWLEDGEMENT AND WAIVER

COVID 19 is a highly infectious virus that can cause serious, life-threatening illness and death. It has led to serious illnesses and deaths in elderly, children, adolescents, younger and middle-aged who are otherwise healthy.

St. Stephen's Church services will follow planned safety steps required by the Massachusetts safety standards for places of worship and the Diocese of Massachusetts guidelines.

I/we understand that my/our attendance and participation in St. Stephen's services can pose a risk of COVID-19 or other contagious or infectious diseases to me, and if I/we are high-risk person(s), as defined by the CDC, I/we should stay home and avoid in-person attendance at services

All must pre-register each week on Wednesday 9:00am to 3:00pm using email ststephenslynn.org or phone 781-599-4220 Ext 5 before the Sunday service. You will receive an acknowledgement of your attendance for the service.

By pre-registering to attend St Stephen's, I /we agree on behalf of myself/ourselves and any children under 18 in my household who will attend with me, that:

- I/we will comply with the safety guidelines set out below and any directions from the ushers, clergy, or St. Stephens staff when arriving, attending, or departing from St Stephen's worship service;
- I/we will wear masks the entire time, entering, inside the building and exiting (except that children under 2 need not wear masks, and parents may decide whether children ages 2 through 4 should wear a mask);
- I/we understand we will be assigned seats and will remain in those seats once shown to them by an
 usher until the service has ended and an usher instructs us that we may exit. All must exit the
 building immediately using the required doors stated below;
- There will be no singing from the congregation, no peace gathering, and communion will be brought to you;
- I/we will maintain physical distancing of at least six feet from anyone not in our household;
- I/we will follow instructions and will not enter any areas of the church buildings except those designated;
- By pre-registering, I represent that neither I nor my household member who will attend the service with me has, during the past 14 days:
 - 1. Tested positive for COVID-19.
 - 2. To our knowledge, have been in close or proximate contact with anyone who has had symptoms of COVID-19.
 - 3. Experienced any symptoms such as fever (100.0 and above) or chills, cough, shortness of breath, sore throat, fatigue, headache, muscle/body aches, runny nose/congestion, new loss of taste or smell, or nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, or any other symptoms known to be associated with COVID-19.
 - 4. And that if I/we or any member of my household develops any symptoms at any time before the service I/we will not come to the church.

By pre-registering, I/we also agree that if within 14 days after attending any service at St. Stephen's I/we or any household member who attended the service with me develops symptoms of COVID-19 or is tested for COVID-19 within that period and receives a positive result, I/we will notify Rev Gregory Perez, who will inform the Board of Health as required. I/we understand and agree that my/our contact information will be saved, and my/our information may be provided to such public health officials in the event it is needed for a contact tracing program.

All people who have been registered will enter the parking lot, Sunday school wing, doorway or the handicap doorway (parking on the grass area is permitted).

Services will begin at 10:00am, doors will be open at 9:40am, and doors will close at 10:10am. No one will be able to enter the church after 10:10am.

I/we understand that COVID-19 is highly contagious and is known to spread mainly from person-to-person contact. By attending St. Stephen's, I/we agree that I/we and any members of my house hold under age 18 who accompany me will abide by the procedures established by the church to protect attendees and staff, and I/we and my household members who attend voluntarily assume the risk that I/we and /or my household may be exposed to or infected by COVID-19 either in the church worship service or on the church premises. I/we agree to assume all risks of attendance and participation for me/us and my/our household, and I/we waive any liability claim against the church and any other parties.

Please have each member of your household 18 or older who is attending the service sign below and list any minors you are signing for. Please bring this completed document with you each Sunday to hand to the Head Usher.
