A Message from Reverend Greg

This month signals the full approach of Fall! It is coming and we cannot do anything about it. For some, it is warmly welcomed after a hot Summer; for others, it is not. Be that as it may, it is upon us.

This process reminds me of the great day of Pentecost. Those gathered in the Upper Room could do nothing to stop the Holy Spirit from landing upon them. Tongues of fire held them in a firm hold and they marveled at the many languages being spoken, yet, they could all understand one another.

In many ways, St. Stephen's is very much like that: we are all diverse in our own ways, yet we belong to one family of faith. We gather each Sunday to amass the prayers of each of us so that as one community, we can lay them before the throne of God.

During the month of October, you will hear me speak of stewardship and the need for each of us who claims St. Stephen's as our spiritual home, to give of our time, talent and treasure. When we all do this as one family of faith, we recognize and celebrate each other. This becomes part of our spiritual practice. Stewardship is a spiritual practice executed out of deep and unshakable gratitude for all that God gives us.

John Wesley was an English clergyman, theologian, and evangelist, who was a leader of a revival movement within the Church of England known as Methodism. It is believed that Wesley once said this: "Do all the good you can, in all the ways you can, to all the souls you can, in every place you can, at all the times you can, with all the zeal you can, as long as ever you can." This is truly a spiritual practice, and it is clearly stewardship.

God's love for us, and God's care for us is much like Fall. We cannot stop it from happening. It falls upon us like leaves falling on our heads! We cannot refute it: God loves us and cares for each of us. What a tremendous gift that is, and when someone gives us a gift, the custom is to say, "Thank you." Our practice of stewardship is our way of saying, "Thank you" to God. It is also our way of acknowledging that even if we tried to stop God from showering us with loving care, we would not succeed.

El Dia de los Muertos (Day of the Dead)

Día de los Muertos is a festival celebrated in Mexico, parts of Central and South America, and increasingly throughout the United States.

- ❖ Day of the Dead is not a sad or scary occasion, but a spirited holiday when people remember and honor family members who have died. All of this is part of the philosophy that death is not something to be feared, but a natural part of life.
- ❖ People celebrate in their homes, creating altars (called *ofrendas* in Spanish) that display portraits, favorite foods, and special possessions of their loved ones.
- ❖ Altars are also decorated with candles and marigolds—the light of the candle and scent of the flowers (called *cempasuchitl*) are said to attract the souls of the deceased and draw them back for a short time to take part in the pleasures they once enjoyed in life.

- Families also visit the graves of their loved ones, cleaning the headstones, and decorating with flowers, and bringing food and music
- ❖ The roots of Day of the Dead are pre-Colombian, and many of the symbols and practices are derived from the indigenous groups of Meso America (Maya and Aztec).
- Images of skeletons dancing or doing other comical things are common.

How to celebrate Dia de los Muertos at St. Stephen's:

- 1. Bring pictures, momentos, cards, etc. of your loved one (Put your name on the back of the item) on Sunday October 24, 2021; leave these with Rev. Greg or an usher.
- 2. Although Day of the Dead is observed on November 2nd, it is perfectly acceptable to remember our deceased loved ones for the entire month of November. **October 31 November 28 will be our 'Month of Remembrance**,' remembering and praying for our deceased loved ones (including our beloved pets).
